<b>Program Overview</b>	The <b>Ritchie Program for School Leaders</b> (ELPS CERT/MA) will enhance the leadership capacity and talent development for schools and districts. This <b>30 credit hour Certificate/45-credit hour Master of Arts principal licensure program</b> develops entrepreneurial and results-oriented leaders to lead school improvement and dramatically improve student outcomes. Students in the program immediately apply their learning and develop leadership competencies while they add value to their school through school-based projects that are focused on continuous improvement. We actively partner with districts to build leadership pipelines by customizing the program to meet district needs. We accomplish this through our work with individual students in our Campus Cohort or collaborating with districts to build district specific cohorts.

<b>Program Location</b>	The program is a combination of hybrid, webinar and in-person classes (if allowed). The summer quarter includes a 2.5 day leadership retreat. Our

	hybrid, flexible model allows us to expand delivery options in order to partner with regions and districts throughout Colorado.
<b>Program Duration</b>	Certificate – 1 year MA – 1.75 years
<b>Program Touch Points</b>	<p>Program components: First year (June to June) – Ritchie Program for School Leaders (CERT – principal licensure); Second Year (June-April) – 15 additional credits for Master of Arts in Educational Leadership and Policy Studies</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Combination of in-person workshops (2-4/quarter) and hybrid online model (weekly discussions/journals)</li> <li>● Quarterly meetings with mentor principal (principal of host school)</li> <li>● Experiential leadership retreat (2.5 days)</li> <li>● Ongoing and personal leadership coaching</li> <li>● Intercultural development – Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI - <a href="https://idiinventory.com/">https://idiinventory.com/</a>) and individual coaching by a trained faculty member</li> <li>● Coursework and projects customized to the leadership needs of the aspiring leader and the school improvement needs of the host school</li> <li>● Unique delivery and staffing model that provides a supportive cohort of peers and a consistent team of instructors, leadership coaches and practicing principals</li> </ul>
