<b>Program Overview</b>	<p>Relay Leadership Regional Support is designed in order to provide regional and school leaders with the additional coaching and development they need in order fully and successfully integrate Relay NPAF and NPSA practices around student culture, data driven instruction, and observation and feedback in a way that has a significant positive impact on teachers and students.</p> <p>Relay Leadership Regional Support pairs Relay Leadership faculty members with high-potential networks in order to achieve the following goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Increase student achievement</li> <li>● Ensure Relay Leadership content around student culture, data driven instruction, and observation and feedback is implemented with fidelity and a high level of skill</li> <li>● Build alignment between leaders within an individual campus and a system of schools</li> <li>● Deepen understanding of the successes and challenges experiences by Relay regional partners</li> <li>● When feasible, build alignment between Relay Leadership and Relay Teaching programs</li> </ul> <p>In order to achieve the goals above, Relay Leadership Regional Support implements a variety of the following support techniques:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>Pre-Engagement Onboarding:</b> planning support in the areas of aligning assessments, building planning structures, student/staff culture, and systems for DDI and obs/fbk</li> <li>● <b>Site Visits:</b> in person visits from Relay Leadership team member(s) focused on implementation feedback and practice labs for regional and school leaders</li> <li>● <b>1 on 1 coaching</b> between Relay Leadership team member(s) to principal supervisor(s) on a weekly or bi-weekly basis. Coaching is designed to increase leader skill and also provide support around region/leader specific needs</li> <li>● <b>Excellent school visits:</b> visits with Relay Leadership team member(s) to schools/networks that exemplify the implementation of Relay practices</li> <li>● <b>Support with school leader development:</b> feedback on and support with the design and execution of professional learning sessions and practice labs aligned with Relay practices; support with Triathlons for school leaders</li> </ul>
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<b>Program Areas of Focus</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Instructional Leadership</li> <li>● Data-Driven Instruction</li> <li>● Teacher Capacity-Building</li> <li>● Planning and Leading High-Quality Professional Development</li> <li>● Strategic Planning</li> </ul>
<b>Program Location</b>	Relay is a national organization. Relay Leadership Regional Support allows Relay faculty members to support districts through on the ground coaching within the network's schools as well as virtually.
<b>Program Duration</b>	Relay Leadership Regional support in an ongoing program, with touchpoints occurring between August 2020 and June 2021, as dictated by the agreed upon scope of work.
<b>Program Touch Points</b>	<p>The Regional Support program is designed specifically to meet the needs of our partner and is therefore different depending on context, level of support, and focus areas. That said, most regional support partnerships include the following touch points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● 1-1 Coaching with School or District Leaders (typically every other week)</li> <li>● On-the-ground site visits 3-5 times over the course of the school year</li> <li>● Professional Development opportunities based on need</li> </ul>

<b>Cost per Participant</b>	The cost for Relay Leadership Regional Support is a function of the number of days of support provided to the network, as defined by the scope of work. Typical regional support partnerships range from \$20,000 to \$60,000 depending on the depth of support requested.
<b>Application Process, Timeline, Due Dates</b>	<p>Step 1: In order to be eligible for Relay Leadership Regional Support, a district should have a previous and/or current commitment to enrolling leaders in the Relay NPAF and Relay NPSA programs.</p> <p>Step 2: The partner district must share its interest in a regional support engagement with the CDE by January 15, 2021. The CDE will then pass recommended partners along to Relay.</p>
