

Item 00:

Present the primary prompt to the student. Read the following prompt exactly as it appears below.	
Primary Prompt:	
Sometimes there is a shortage of a good or a service. What could a city government do when	
a lack of rain causes a drought?	
Point to and read each answer option aloud:	
Restrict lawn watering, Encourage car washing at home, Raise the price of gasoline	
Choose your answer.	
The student receives a score of 4 for a correct response.	
If the student does not respond, repeat the primary prompt and answer options <i>only once</i> , exactly as they app	
If the student responds correctly after the second presentation of the primary prompt, the student receives a s of 4.	score
If the student responds incorrectly or does not respond after repeating the primary prompt, move to Level 3.	
Turn the page and present the additional prompt to the student.	
Present the primary prompt and answer options again, exactly as they appear above.	
The student receives a score of 3 for a correct response. If the student does not respond or responds incorrectly, move to Level 2.	
If the student does not respond of responds incorrectly, move to Level 2.	
Point to the correct answer and read aloud:	
A city government could restrict lawn watering when there is a drought.	
Present the primary prompt and answer options again, exactly as they appear above.	
The student receives a score of 2 for a correct response.	
If the student does not respond or responds incorrectly, move to Level 1.	
If the student responds incorrectly at Level 2, the student receives a score of 1.	
If the student does not respond at Level 2, the student receives a score of No Response (NR).	Г
