



Assessment Administration: The Basics

The goal of test administration is to collect valid data about student performance.

Per state law, every Colorado student enrolled in a public school is required to take either the state assessments in the appropriate grade levels and content areas.



Assessment Administration: Test Parameters

Fair

- The benefits are directed at those who bear the burden of testing
- Free of bias

Valid

The test actually measures what we claim it measures

Reliable

- The test is repeatable and the results are comparable.
- "One student's score means the same thing as the same score, achieved by another student"

Standardization

 Conditions which are necessary to ensure fairness, validity and reliability




Assessment Administration: Accommodations

- Documented Education Plan
- Standard Accommodations
 - The Accommodations Manual
- Non-standard Accommodations
 - November 1 December 13
- Linguistic Accommodations
 - The Accommodations Guide
 - Relying on a body of evidence



Administration, Misadministration, and Invalidation

- Facilities
- Proctor Administration
- Contingencies
- Pre-exposure
 - "Practice" items
 - Test sessions given out of order
- Unethical behavior





Assessment Administration: Key Principle

• Due to the complex nature of a standardized assessment process, any practice not specifically permitted should be presumed inappropriate until and unless specifically authorized by the program sponsor (in this case, CDE).



Security

- Materials Security
 - Chain of custody
 - Access
 - Reproduction and more
- Test Data Security
 - Student identity
 - District security
 - Public and media embargoes






Data Review and Score Release

- October Student Count
- N-Count
- Student Biographical Information Review (SBD)
- Test Score Releases
 - ACCESS for ELLs, late April
 - TCAP Grade 3 reading, early June
 - Other grades and content areas, mid-July
 - Media and public embargo release, early August
