NOTICE OF WRITTEN PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD FOR ABRAHAM LINCOLN HIGH SCHOOL IN DENVER PUBLIC SCHOOLS DURING THE MARCH 2024 COLORADO STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING

Schools and districts not meeting expectations in achievement, growth, and/or postsecondary workforce readiness, as determined by the School and District Performance Frameworks, are assigned a plan type of Priority Improvement or Turnaround. Per state law, schools and districts cannot retain one of those plan types for five consecutive years before significant action must be taken. If a school or district receives a plan type of Priority Improvement or Turnaround for five consecutive years, then the State Board of Education must direct an action to the local board of education. Under the Accountability Act, these actions may include: (1) partial or full management by a public or private entity, (2) Innovation status, (3) conversion to a charter school, (4) conversion to a community school, or (5) closure.

If a school or district does not make significant improvements in the two years following a State Board of Education directed an action, then the State Board of Education must evaluate progress and determine whether to continue the current directed action, or to direct a new action.

In 2023, Abraham Lincoln High School received its sixth consecutive rating of Priority Improvement or Turnaround. Denver Public Schools will present an accountability pathway plan to the state board on March 13, 2024 at 1:30PM (MT).

The Colorado State Board of Education is seeking input from students, families, school staff, and community members on the upcoming Abraham Lincoln High School hearing. Members of the public may:

- comment on the school's current status and effectiveness, and
- provide input regarding State Board-directed actions (what should be done moving forward).

Comments may be submitted ANY of the following ways:

Public comment submissions may not be related to personnel matters.

The deadline for all written comments is Friday, March 8th, 2024, at 5:00PM (MT). Comments will be compiled by the State Board of Education Office and sent to all State Board members. All submissions will become part of the official record for the hearings and posted publicly. Personal information will be redacted before public posting. Comments submitted in languages other than English will be translated into English as time permits. Comments received past the deadline will not be included in the record or forwarded to the State Board.
