Preliminary injunction on March 20 executive order

Today, a <u>federal judge in Massachusetts issued a preliminary injunction</u> that blocks the <u>March 20 executive order</u> entitled "Improving Education Outcomes by Empowering Parents, States, and Communities." The preliminary injunction also requires that ED reinstate employees previously laid off in March 2025. It is important to note that ED has appealed the decision and there will likely be additional news and action related to this item.
