Growing Readers Together & Early Childhood in Colorado

- Up to <u>57% of children under 6</u> are cared for informally by family members, friends, & neighbors (FFN caregivers)
- GRT prioritizes & supports library service to FFN caregivers
- <u>GOAL</u>: To increase FFN's awareness of library resources and services through outreach, community partnerships, and relationship building.
