HESTL Library Staff are:

- More likely to provide extended learning opportunities for learners (clubs, maker spaces, etc.)
- Equity equalizers skilled in building diverse, high-quality collections.
- Customer service experts who make the library a welcoming, fun, and safe place for all students, staff, and community.
- Collaborative partners with administration, staff, and community partners, seeking ways to carry out school's goals and focus.
- Leaders, providing professional development opportunities, advocating and exploring ways for more funding for library books, materials, and more.
- Specialists in media literacy, digital citizenship, technology literacy, reading literacy, and learning skills, finding ways to partner and collaborate with teachers.
- Curiosity experts who help students discover their interests and ignite their passions.
- Advocates to help empower students by honoring student voice and building students' voice into learning experiences.
- Share their expertise and use resources to provide students, staff, and community with a library collection unique to their school.
