The Bully, The Bullied, and the Not-So-Innocent Bystander

It takes much more than slogans, posters, and anti-bullying programs to break the cycle of violence and to create more caring, inclusive communities. Bravehearted students willing to step up and step in to stop these attacks can't do it alone. In this session, we will discuss verbal, physical, relational, and cyberbullying violence and its effects on a school community, and especially on students with disabilities. Participants will receive tips, tools, strategies, and handouts to bring back to their educational communities.

Attendees will:

- Discern the difference between normal, natural, and necessary conflict and bullying; and understand why the tools for conflict resolution are ineffective and damaging when used for bullying incidences.
- Identify the ways and means of bullying.
- Know what to do and not do if a student targets a student with disabilities.
- Know what to do and not do if a student with disabilities targets another student.
- Understand why students don't tell that they are being targeted.
- Identify the four antidotes against bullying and understand the Three P's for creating safe harbor for students with disabilities.

Barbara Coloroso is an international bestselling author and educator, and for the past 52 years an internationally recognized speaker and consultant on parenting, teaching, school discipline, positive school climate, bullying, grieving, nonviolent conflict resolution, and restorative justice.
