DBI Takeaways

Intensive Intervention

- Address severe and persistent learning or behavioral difficulties
- Driven by data
- Characterized by increased intensity and individualization
- Reserved for students who have not responded to secondary intervention program
- Can be used for students with IEPs who are not responding to their current programming, a way to provide specially designed instruction (SDI)

Data Based Individualization

- A systematic method for using data to determine when and how to provide more intensive intervention
- Ongoing process
- Intended for students with severe and persistent learning and behavioral needs
- 5 Steps
 - Step 1: Validated Intervention Programs
 - Step 2: Progress Monitoring

If the student is responding, continue using intervention program, if not responding, go to step 3

- Step 3: Diagnostic Data
- Step 4: Intervention Adaptation
- Step 5: Progress Monitoring

If the student is responding, continue using intervention program, if not responding, go back to step 3

 - A process

- o Individualized based on student needs
- o More intense, often with substantively different content AND pedagogy
- o An approach that integrates academic and behavioral supports

DBI within Special Education

- DBI is a way to provide SDI, tied to IEP goals and individualized to the student

- Also called Tier 2 or supplemental interventions, remedial curriculum or small group interventions
