Brad Weiner, M. Ed., NBCT, CAPE - is the 2013 National Adapted Physical Education Teacher of the Year residing in Maryland. He holds certification in special education birth - 21, physical education birth - 21, and administration. Brad has 17 years of experience serving students with and without disabilities ages 3 – 21 years. He is currently providing service to school-age students with multiple disabilities and preschool students with diverse needs. Brad has been the project manager on various curriculum development teams across all ages. He has developed non-standardized assessment tools, and a plan to support students transitioning out of school. Over his career he has coached multiple sports for Special Olympics, developed an adapted sports program, volunteered and consulted for nonprofits, and was the executive director for Camp Abilities Maryland, Inc. Brad has had the opportunity to serve the National Consortium for Physical Education for Individuals with Disabilities (NCPEID) organization as their secretary, vice president, and is currently an APENS committee member. Between 2017 and 2019, he served as the chair for the Society of Health and Physical Education (SHAPE) America's special interest group for adapted physical education/activity. He has also served as the Maryland Adapted Physical Education Consortium (MAPEC) president, vice president, and is currently the presidential advisor. Brad indicated that he strives to provide an inclusive environment for every student in every class, promoting a feeling of acceptance, belonging, and value.
