## **Meeting Activities**

#### Welcome

Melissa Colsman, Associate Commissioner of Student Learning, CDE provided the opening. She welcomed all of the Dyslexia Working Group (DWG) members.

## Launch Activity

Debbie Hunsaker engaged the DWG in a discussion around their personal reasons for being a part of the DWG and what the DWG will mean to Colorado families, schools, principals, teachers, and students.

#### Context Setting

Melissa Colsman discussed the norms of observers in the room and provided information on HB 19-1134, the READ Act, and the Dyslexia Pilot.

Debbie Hunsaker reviewed the processes the DWG will be using to work together as a team, and the DWG discussed the benefits of the processes.

# Standards of Quality and Scope of Work

Debbie reviewed sections 22-20.5-103 (2) (a-g) from House Bill 19-1134 (the authorizing statute for the DWG) and discussed the timeline for the DWG, including the September meeting which focused on HB 19-1134 22-20.5-103 (a) *The working group will analyze state and national data and practices concerning identification and support of students with dyslexia in order to achieve the Standards of Quality.* Future meetings will focus on the following:

- Recommending dyslexia screening tools and processes
- Creating a statewide plan for identifying and supporting students with dyslexia
- Considering educator training in recognizing and providing interventions for students with dyslexia
- Providing recommendations to the department concerning the design and implementation of the pilot program

## Subcommittee Work Time

Subcommittees were formed to review and analyze state plans that have current Dyslexia legislation and resources (i.e., guides and handbooks). Each subcommittee shared their findings and recommended whether or not to continue to analyze and research each state plan. DWG members signed up for reading the recommended state plans in preparation for the October 17<sup>th</sup> meeting.
