MEETING ACTIVITIES

1. Colorado Department of Education updates to the Dyslexia Working Group [10:15-10:25]

Floyd Cobb (CDE) shared the following updates:

- An early Literacy assessment tool vendor has been selected
- READ Act diagnostic and summative assessments will be a Board meeting agenda item in April
 - \circ Interim Assessments board needs to vote and this list exists in rule $% \left({{{\mathbf{x}}_{i}}} \right)$.
 - Summative assessments: not required (optional).
 - Diagnostic assessments: Statute (C.R.S. 22-7-1205(b)) permits local education providers to use "...other diagnostic reading assessments in addition to but not in lieu of the approved assessment." These assessments can come as a package (or schools can choose another product). CDE recommendation: have diagnostic assessment match list of interim assessments.
- Pilot schools/dyslexia pilot is progressing and CDE is looking forward to finalizing it

2. Dyslexia Policy Updates

3. Small Group Activity

DWG members formed small groups to revise, refine, and clarify action steps in the three working groups:

- Assessment This group is focusing on three key tasks: 1) organizing existing resources so assessment information is easier for group members to find; 2) identifying a Spanish screener; and 3) refining the dyslexia screening chart.
- *Educator Prep:* This group is creating a chart to show what educators need to know about dyslexia, e.g., age-level characteristics, gold standard concepts that should be taught, resources, assessments, programming, data, teaching methods / science of reading. They will continue refining the chart.
- *Teacher Training:* This group wants it to be easier for teachers to get a dyslexia endorsement. They will look at what other states are doing; will explore if there is a reciprocity system across states that could be possible.
