- Continuing with development of DWG recommendations

Meeting Activities:

- Welcome/Introductions
 - DWG member intros and check-in
 - Review meeting norms/public comment process
- CDE Updates/ Legislative and Budget Updates
 - Joanna Bruno shared the following updates:
 - Overall Budget
 - The Colorado General Assembly is well into the 2025 legislative session, with Sunday marking the halfway point of the 120-day session.
 - The budget continues to be the biggest item this session as the legislature works to address a budget shortfall of nearly \$1 billion.
 - CDE budget hearing was earlier this week, and while legislators are tentatively slated to cut about \$10 million from CDE's operational

budget, they also gave tentative approval to the Department READ Act request:

- o Reinvesting READ Act Funds \$3,361,59 Approved
- Thank you to everyone who signed the letter supporting the request we really appreciate it.
- We'll know more once final decisions are made after the March economic forecast, which is scheduled for March 17th.
- School Finance
 - Given the budget, there has been a lot of discussion around school finance and how the legislature approaches school finance – in particular implementation of the new school finance formula that the legislature approved last year, as well as the Governor's proposal to eliminate multi-year averaging in districts facing declining enrollment.
 - The Joint Budget Committee will review CDE's School Finance budget next week and will make decisions in the coming weeks.
- Dyslexia Related Legislation
 - We still haven't seen any dyslexia-related legislation introduced although based on questions we continue to receive from legislators, we do anticipate there will be something introduced eventually.
 - We just don't have a clear sense of what that will look like once we have more information, we will share it with you all.
- Mandy Harris shared the following updates:
 - Cross Departmental Collaboration
 - A small, cross departmental collaborative team has been formed to evaluate DWG recommended guidance documents and to prepare for publishing with the field. This team has developed a CDE Dyslexia Initiatives Action Plan specific to the work in our offices that intersects with Dyslexia Working Group recommendations.
 - Team individuals from the following offices:

 - Clarification on how to use and who intended user(s) are

 - Inclusive language for broader uses within schools
 - "Developed in Partnership with Dyslexia Working Group"
 - Resource will be shared with CDE offices for broad dissemination and to raise awareness and/or provide trainings on

- Trending Concerns from the Field on Dyslexia Screening
 - How, When, and How Often to use dyslexia screeners from interims?
 - After a positive risk indicator for dyslexia what happens?
 - How to communicate with parents
 - School capacity to serve increased numbers of students identified with characteristics of dyslexia
 - Screener impact on special education systems, Tier II and Tier III
 Instructional assumptions/misinterpretation
 - Overidentification/misidentification based on standalone singular screener, especially concerning multilingual learners
- We continue to offer ongoing support to the field around dyslexia (ELSR specific updates)
 - o Amplify (ongoing additional measures trainings for our ELAT grantees)
 - By-Request Supports
 - Thought-partnering on systems being built by districts for dyslexia screening
 - Facilitating district-to-district connections for broadening professional learning communities
 - Ongoing, free CDE Professional Development
 - High-quality, Tier I instruction and implementation
 - Data-based Decision Making
 - MTSS and RtI structures and supports
- DWG's input on K-2 measures that would be value add (currently limited data on how students are progressing on literacy)
- Rhonda led a discussion about the 1241 task for recommendation to include K-2 into a public dashboard. She asked the DWG what K-2 measures they might find valuable to be considered in a dashboard. The measures could include both state and local measures (1241 Task Force Dashboard Recommendations page 42-45).

- Group Work
 - Small groups spent time reviewing the recommendations and contributing ideas about what they think might be valuable to consider on a dashboard (KRS, chronic absenteeism rates, SRD rates, #s of literacy specialist, etc.).
 - Small groups continued work on recommendation revisions.
 - Large group discussion to report out on conversations in the small groups and identify any support needed from the larger group or to be prepared for the May meeting.
