Standards vs. Curriculum



Standards are broad learning goals articulating what students should know, understand and be able to do over a given time.

A curriculum is an organized plan of instruction comprised of a sequence of instructional units that engages students in mastering the standards. Resources such as instructional materials and textbooks are supports for the curriculum.

Standards and Curriculum in Colorado

Standards

In Colorado, standards are developed by Colorado teachers and go through a public feedback process before being approved by the Colorado State Board of Education.

Curriculum

In Colorado, local school boards choose the curriculum for their schools. This is because Colorado is a local control state, therefore, curriculum decisions are left to the local school districts.

Example of a Standard for Seventh-Grade Social Studies

Use geographic tools and sources such as maps, globes, diagrams, charts, and geographic data and technologies to research and make geographic inferences and predictions about the Eastern Hemisphere. (Code: SS.7.2.1).
