Sample Measures of Student Outcomes for Occupational Therapists

Direct Measures of Student Outcomes:

- Increased participation in school routines and learning activities
- Progress monitoring data of student learning objectives/IEP goals
- Self-Assessments
- Increased competence or autonomy in student role
- Performance based assessments
- Standardized assessments (pre and post-test)
- Interim assessment of skills
- Increased health and wellness as seen by active and positive choices for physical, mental, and social participation
- Data on student use of accommodations/modifications

Indirect Measures of Student Outcomes:

- Increased team satisfaction with student performance
- Prevention of further difficulties
- Increased team/team member competence in supporting students
- Recommendations for parents and teachers for supporting students
- Referral to resources to support student (e.g., community programs/resources, other disciplines)
- Co-treating/Co-teaching
- Data on progress toward school/district UIP attainment
- Implementation/monitoring of the benefit of accommodations and modifications
