Remarks Karla Esser State Board of Education	Have had two months of meetings because of social studies HB 1192, including the lived history of LGBTQ and BIPOC students in the US. MOstly with LGBTQ- being moved back in June to get more feedback. Community that came to speak overwhelming support for 1192 into the standards. Also bringing up Genocide and Holicost. Group of BIPOC high school girls advocating for HB 1192. SEL considered "woke" and want them out of standards (people in opposition believe that it teaches students to think freely). 5000 written responses for HB 1192. Sending in more written approvals for bill.

Question: Supreme Court happenings with Roe Vs. Wade.- concerned about implications. With local control, cannot dictate curriculum and what is taught from a Supreme Court level. Board is expanding to 9 members with addition of CD* (makes even as SBE). Will also be a state-wide at-large seat as well. Need for integration of SEL, seeking outside community resources of what is available in the summer. Importance of education and awareness of SEL. Students are masking SEL needs and being considerate of needs, especially executive functioning skills. They are emotionally dysregulated at the end of the day because they are regulating all day. Educator: Impotence of communicating with other educators and advocating for GT learners and various needs. Code switching with GT educators and general teachers. Programs for education that are in sylos (psy and sped programming having to take on GT students with no specialization for integration). Ideas of LRE (least restrictive Environment) and how this still applies to our GT students. **Community:** Shared community awareness and responsibility for gifted students. Representation for diverse populations for school counselors. PEBC workforce Forum- graduating less people than ever. Community needs to have Mental health for parents and teachers. Integrating more SEL instead of adding because of capacity. Funds for state-wide curriculum additions for SEL. Parent Camp/training for to support students Adjunct/ Ex-officio: CD3 region, some of GT secondary skills are taking on adult/support roles for suicide because of lack of discussions from adults.
