- Can take form of
 - Part-time job
 - Internship
 - Apprenticeship
 - Volunteer opportunities
- Benefits
 - Skills reinforcement, extension, and enhancement
 - Real-world exposure
 - Development of workplace survival skills


One of the ways FRCC awards college credit for WBL

- Attach the WBL experience to a for-credit Internship course
- Requirements the internship must:
 - 1. align with the course of study the student is pursuing
 - 2. be in a course of study that allows internship credit
 - 3. be specific learning outcomes defined for the experience
 - 4. include sufficient hours working in the subject area to earn college credit
- Students must be enrolled for the Internship course in the semester when the work experience takes place, and tuition must be paid for the credits earned

Process Outline

- Identify the WBL opportunity
 - identify learning opportunities
 - check alignment with student's course of study
 - develop the job description and performance rubric
 - complete the internship application
- Sign off on internship application (contract)
- Faculty and hiring manager touch base at regular intervals
- Hiring manager submits final performance review to faculty
- Faculty meets with student, measures performance vs rubric, and assigns student a grade
