### Student End-of Year Data Collection

May marks the opening of the Student End-of-Year data collection. Please be sure to be in touch with your district data respondent for McKinney-Vento eligible students to ensure we are submitted accurate data.

In September, the Colorado Department of Education will be conducting data validation checks for districts:

- Reporting no homeless students
- Removal of homeless designation between October count and 6/30/23
- 5% decrease in identification from October to the End-of Year Collection
- Statistically significant changes form one year to the next

### Federal Grant Opportunity

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services through the Administration for Children and Families has released a Notice of Funding. This opportunity is for Basic Center Programs providing temporary shelter and counseling services to youth who have left home without permission of their parents or guardians, have been forced to leave home, or other homeless youth who might otherwise end up in the law enforcement or in the child welfare, mental health, or juvenile justice systems.
