

McKinney-Vento- December 2021

Application Deadline for Formula Funding to Support McKinney Students Has Been Extended

The applications for the U.S. Department of Education section 2001(b)(1) of the <u>American Rescue Plan Act of 2021</u> funding to help support school districts in serving students experiencing homelessness has been **extended to March 1, 2022**.

The purposes of this funding include increasing the identification of homeless children and youth, providing wraparound services considering the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, and providing assistance needed to enable homeless children and youth to attend school and participate fully in school activities.

Applications must be completed and submitted through the <u>online application</u>. Please see complete details on the <u>McKinney-Vento Website</u> as well as the <u>recording</u> from the October 21st informational webinar.
