2.01(c) - Private companies that ONLY provide school transportation fall under CDE; companies that provide more public transportation (limousines, party buses, motorcoaches, etc.) are under the jurisdiction of the PUC.

Frank - Because of the shortage there are a lot of strategies being looked at. How well are those strategies being reviewed and covered?

All schools and charters are still covered by CDE.

David Romero - You mentioned new supervisors, does this include everyone?

This training is only for individuals who are new to their supervisory positions. For those who have been in their position, this is not required.

Lance Yoxsimer - I personally don't love it, as I believe that we are setting districts up for non-compliance because they won't know that they will need it

The other part of this is that these Rules will also go to Superintendents. CDE typically finds out that someone is new within a year of their employment.

5.01, 5.02, 5.03 - Proper Use of Physical Restraint C.R.S. standard is removed and relocated into a different section.

David Romer - Will this apply to service providers?

Yes.

Lance Yoxsimer - If we, as a district have a policy that is "hands-off" so we don't have training will this satisfy this requirement?

Yes. As long as it is documented that the policy has been reviewed.

David Romero - Will the paraprofessional DQF piece be put back on the CDE file requirement documentation?

Lance Yoxsimer - Is this the same frequency as the Hands-On tester?

Yes, the language mirrors the Annual Hands-On Tester.

Sharon Souza - Can my trainer do this?

No, she will need to go through the Hands-on Trainer class.

Frank Phillips - So you certify that they can train ELDT to people, and now you're going to certify that they can train trainers?

Yes. This person can then train other people to be ELDT trainers.

Donna Grattino - Can we train our drivers with an online theory course?

Yes, you can, if it is theory and if you have a certification of completed. We have not developed that for Colorado, so there will be a cost associated with those if you go with an outside company. The online courses are generic and not specific to Colorado.

The CDE ELDT program tests can be completed online.

David Romero - Regardless of where they trained, I have a link that shows if the information has been input into the TPR.



Minimum Standards - Pertains to vehicles and the requirements of those vehicles.

- 3.4 Added in the piece on "service providers."
- 4.3 Per federal law, the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA) has regulatory jurisdiction over the purchase or lease of NEW, not including used school transportation small-capacity vehicles.

NHTSA defines a 15-passenger van, as a van that holds 10-15 passengers.

Is a Ford Transit considered a van?

Yes, they can use that vehicle, as long as the capacity is 12 or under.

What capacity needs to follow rack and load?

Vehicles with a capacity greater than 12

Transportation Tast Force

Update: A year again the legislature description and for a Transportation Task Force. We have been meeting for the past pear, but the lave gone through and sent out surveys to get information from drivers and financial data. The task force does not make laws but will make recommendations as to changes that need to be made.

One of the things that we were tasked with is how we can attract, train, and retain transportation staff. Each meeting is open to the public; the links are on our website under School Transportation Task Force, under our contact information. The next meeting will be in July and will be on funding. We will wait and see where it lands, but you are welcome to watch these meetings.

In regards to the training on the proper use of restraints, the language states prior to transporting students. Could that be changed to reflect within 90 days?

School/work days or calendar days?

The map is out of date. Is there something on the map for third-party testers?

That is more of a CDL question, but CDL compliance will release that information.

Is there a place where we can find the trainers that have been revoked? ELDT training companies that have been shut down by FMCSA.

There is something on the TPR website that allows for you to look up providers in a region.

You had sent out a federal link regarding the rescheduling of marijuana - have you heard anything more on this?

We have not.
