UIP Timeline for Districts that took COVID-19 Flexibility in Spring 2020	UIP public posting shifts from April 15 to October 15	To provide additional flexibility to systems at the beginning of the COVID-19 crisis, the deadline for submitting plans for public posting was extended in spring 2020. For schools and districts that need their plans reviewed by CDE (e.g., accountability clock, on watch, ESSA CS schools), feedback will be available within six weeks of submission. Schools submitting in October for review will not be required to resubmit in January for review, however, may need to resubmit for public posting.	
UIP Timeline for ESSA Comprehensive Support and	UIP submitted for review no later than Jan 15, 2021 (Oct 15 or Jan 15 – whichever applies)	To ensure alignment between state and ESSA review processes, all schools identified as a CS school under ESSA must submit plans for review. If the plan is approved by the department, then another review on the ESSA-related requirements will not be needed, within the next 3 years, unless the school is re-identified as CS under ESSA.
